**SUICIDE** is getting a lot of publicity this week due to some prominent peoples' deaths. Our life is a gift from God whose beginning and end can only belong to the Lord of Life. The act of ending one's life deliberately is a serious sin that could lead to condemnation because there is no chance for repentance and forgiveness after death. It used to be that Catholic funerals and burials were denied to the family of a person who had committed suicide—to avoid any appearance of indifference or even approval of suicide. In our time we have funeral Masses and burials in a Catholic cemetery because it is possible that a person's state of mind (for example, profound depression) might have made them less than fully free in 'deciding' to end their life. We cannot judge if God will forgive or condemn someone who has taken their own life and so we plead with God for mercy. Please pray for people whose helpless and hopeless feelings tempt them to consider this horrible decision that harms so many living family members afterwards. Any priest will listen to someone in this situation—our cell phones are always on for emergency. Toll-free suicide hotline: 1-800-273-8255.

**FROM THE CATHOLIC CATECHISM** 2281 *Suicide contradicts the natural inclination of the human being to preserve and perpetuate his life. It is gravely contrary to the just love of self. It likewise offends love of neighbor because it unjustly breaks the ties of solidarity with family, nation, and other human societies to which we continue to have obligations. Suicide is contrary to love for the living God.* 2282 *If suicide is committed with the intention of setting an example, especially to the young, it also takes on the gravity of scandal. Voluntary co-operation in suicide is contrary to the moral law. Grave psychological disturbances, anguish, or grave fear of hardship, suffering, or torture can diminish the responsibility of the one committing suicide.* 2283 *We should not despair of the eternal salvation of persons who have taken their own lives. By ways known to him alone, God can provide the opportunity for salutary repentance. The Church prays for persons who have taken their own lives.*

**CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATÓLICA** El Respeto a la salud (#2288-2291) *La vida y la salud física son bienes preciosos confiados por Dios. Debemos cuidar de ellos racionalmente teniendo en cuenta las necesidades de los demás y el bien común. El cuidado de la salud de los ciudadanos requiere la ayuda de la sociedad para lograr las condiciones de existencia que permiten crecer y llegar a la madurez: alimento y vestido, vivienda, cuidados de la salud, enseñanza básica, empleo y asistencia social. La moral exige el*

*respeto de la vida corporal, pero no hace de ella un valor absoluto. Se opone una concepción neo pagana que tiende a promover el culto del cuerpo, a sacrificar todo a él, a idolatrar la perfección física y el éxito deportivo. Semejante concepción, por la selección que opera entre los fuertes y los débiles, puede conducir a la perversión de las relaciones humanas. La virtud de la templanza conduce a evitar toda clase de excesos, el abuso de la comida, del alcohol, del tabaco y de las medicinas. Quienes en estado de embriaguez, o por afición inmoderada de velocidad, ponen en peligro la seguridad de los demás y la suya propia en las carreteras, en el mar o en el aire, se hacen gravemente culpables. El uso de drogas inflige muy graves daños a la salud y a la vida humana. Fuera de los casos en que se recurre a ellos por las prescripciones estrictamente terapéuticas, es una falta grave. La producción clandestina y el tráfico de drogas son prácticas escandalosas; constituyen una cooperación directa, porque incitan a ellas, a prácticas gravemente contrarias a la ley moral.*
